


# Bungo-Ono Travel Map

### Roadside Station Harajiri Falls MAP B-3



This roadside station is best known for Harajiri Falls, one of the "Top 100 Waterfalls of Japan." The on-site restaurant is especially popular for its "Furusato Bento," a lunch box filled with seasonal specialties. Local treats such as kabosu (a citrus fruit) soft-serve ice cream are also available.



## Asakura Fumio Memorial Hall

The Asakura Fumio Memorial Hall honors Fumio Asakura, an honorary citizen of Bungo-Ono and a pioneering sculptor who helped establish the foundations of modern Japanese sculpture. The collection spans his entire career, from student works to late masterpieces, and includes highlights such as *Tomb Guard* and the cat sculptures he was so fond of. Set amidst lush greenery, it's a peaceful place to slow down and enjoy art at your own pace.
